# Jr. College To Open

FORT LAUDERDALE — A junior college center for Negro students probably will open next September at Dillard High School, Dr. Joe B. Rushing, Broward Junior College president, said Friday.

"We are making a study now to determine the need for a Negro center and in all probability a program will be developed for next year," Rushing said.

The curriculum will parallel that of the present junior college although other courses may be added if the need warrants it, he said.

Rushing said surveys based on experiences in other counties show a potential of about 300 Negro college students in Broward.

The BJC president is setting up a committee to determine a site for a permanent junior college which he hopes will be ready for occupancy in September 1962. The present college, which opened this year, temporarily is housed at the old Naval Air Station.

The Legislature is expected to appropriate money next spring to start construction on the initial permanent unit of the college and Rushing already has a tentative priority building list.

Rushing's committee also will decide on locations for other centers as the junior college expands. On the basis of current population projections, estimates are at least three centers will be needed within 10 years.
