

Junior College Offers Freshmen 40 Courses

Classes Slated To Begin Sept. 6

The Junior College of Broward County will open its first section next fall with an offering of more than 40 different courses for first year students, Dr. Joe Rushing, president, announced today.

Dr. Rushing reported that he had 175 applications from prospective students of all ages as of the week-end.

Curriculum, announced for six college departments, is comparable to that offered by other institutions of higher education and is designed to assure ease in transferring credit, Dr. Rushing said.

Other course offerings may be announced during the summer as college officials receive requests and find evidence of other interests, the president added.

Classes will begin Sept. 6 in about eight frame buildings now occupied by New River Junior High School and Driftwood Elementary School at the old World War II Naval Air Station site at Broward County International Airport.

Curriculum will include classes in English, French, Spanish and journalism in the Department of Language and Literature.

The Department of Science and Mathematics will offer courses in biology, chemistry, algebra, trigonometry and general mathematics.

History, political science, education and psychology will be given by the Department of Social Science, while the Fine Arts Department will include music, art, speech and drama.

The Department of Business and Economics will schedule classes in business administration, secretarial science, accounting and economics.

Courses in health education and physical education will be taught in the Department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

With these course offerings, the new junior college can serve students with a wide range of interests, Dr. Rushing said.

The president reported he was thinking in terms of a total staff of 30 to 32 persons. The teachers will all be classified as instructors, with no faculty ranks, he said.

A normal course load will be considered to be 15 semester hours, for which Broward County residents will pay a matriculation fee of \$50 and a student activity fee of \$10.

For students taking less than 12 hours of courses, the matriculation fee will be prorated and no activity fee will be necessary. Students may enroll in only one course if they desire.
