Financial Deals Are On Cash Basis

Here's a few reminders to all students: Business transactions with BJC are on a cash basis. The only way to receive a refund from the withdraw of Broward Junior at this late date is when the withdrawal is made for the convenience of the college.

A fee of one dollar will be made for each and every check returned to BJC by the bank regardless of reason for the check not being accepted. A fee of one dollar will be charged each and every time a change is made in a student's program because of a course being dropped.

Official grade reports and transcripts of credit earned will not be released by the college until all financial obligations to the college have been paid in full.

A suggestion to all students, try to develop car pools or use city buses as much as possible. This will ease the strain of having available car space for students. Drivers, remember that the speed limit is 25 miles an hour. Cars are not to be driven or parked on lawns, tennis or basketball courts.

For the first ticket a student receives, he is let off with a warning. The second infraction charges five dollars and a third revokes a parking permit for the rest of the semester. So watch where and how you park.
