## COLLEGE PROGRAM OFFERS TOUR TO EUROPE, SOUTH AMERICA, THE YUCATAN

Travel is a doubly enriching experience when combined with study and many students nationwide will be taking advantage of the low-rate plan.

Broward Community College will be offering travel-learning programs to destinations which include South America, the Yucatan, and two different tours to Europe.

The three-week Latin American package will go to Ecuador, Peru, Argentina and Brazil. On this one, it's possible to earn nine semester hours of credit, six in International Travel and three in Conversational Spanish. It may also be taken for audit.

The history department of BCC will hold seminars prior to July 16 departure as will the communications department. Tour price includes round trip economy air fare to Latin America and between cities to be visited; continental breakfasts; all main meals in Cuzco; sightseeing; tips and taxes. Tuition is \$72.

A limit of 20 students has been placed on the Merida, Yucatan, Mexico anthropology field trip. This course is designed to teach the methods of field research in the social sciences, particularly anthropology. In the four weeks devoted to the program, three will be spent on site. Because this is a classroom module, it carries a prerequisite of anthropology 225 and/or permission of instructor.

BCC's European tours are under two different departments.

Business Administration is sponsoring a travel-study tour featuring London, Brussels, Amsterdam, Zurich and Paris for three weeks beginning July 22. Under this plan, six semester hours may be earned in business and marketing. It is open to all business majors with a tour price that includes air fare on a scheduled line, most meals, all hotels, sightseeing and unlimited ground travel.

The other European tour covers London, Leningrad, Moscow, Geneva and Paris. It combines several days of pre-study of the historical backgrounds of the countries to be visited and a debriefing on return to the United States. It is possible to earn three to six semes-

ter hours credit in International Travel or three semester hours in art and three in IT.

Because BCC is open to any resident over 18, some of these trips are available to anyone meeting the age requirement and enrolling with the registrar.

All tours are economically priced to encourage richer living and learning experiences.
