JSTOR (Journal STORAGE)

JSTOR provides access to the full-text articles of the complete **back files** of core scholarly journals in the humanities, mathematics, sciences, and social sciences. More than 100 scholarly journals are digitized/scanned, so that they include full-page images that look just like the original. Coverage is generally from the beginning with the first volume through issues published prior to the most recent three to five years. JSTOR **does not** provide **current issues** of journals. Please use other databases for accessing full-text articles of current issues of journals.

Access to JSTOR:

On Campus

You can access JSTOR through the FAU LUIS computers located near the U/CL Reference desk.


Off Campus

JSTOR is restricted to current FAU students, faculty, and staff. You will need to use FAU Libraries EZ-Proxy in your home/office computer to access JSTOR. To access FAU Libraries EZ-Proxy, please go to <https://login.ezproxy.fau.edu/login> and type in your 14-digit library number (without spaces) located on the Owl card.

Searching Strategies

- JSTOR allows you to browse or search the journals.
- Searches can be limited to: Disciplines, Journals, Publication dates, and Types of articles.

JSTOR offers downloading and printing options in the PDF format using Adobe Acrobat Reader.

To download/print JSTOR articles, you will need the Adobe Acrobat Reader. All University/College Library computers should have this reader installed. To download a free copy of Adobe Acrobat Reader, go to <http://www.adobe.com/acrobat>

Downloading Instructions for PDF:

Download this article in PDF format by following these steps:

[PDF: High Quality](#) - Larger file size with high quality resolution

[PDF: Economy](#) - Smaller file size with fax quality resolution

To print the article, follow these steps:

1. Click on Download. (If you click on "Print", you must print using PDF: High Quality, which will take much longer to print.)
2. From the "Item to be Downloaded:" page, scroll down and choose PDF: Economy – Smaller file size with fax quality resolution. This option will download the article in Acrobat PDF format within your browser.
3. NOTE: It may take several minutes for the article to download in Acrobat. You cannot print the article until the entire article is downloaded. Click on the download link only once – multiple clicks will delay the downloading of the article.
4. Once the article has downloaded successfully, click on the Print button within your browser or choose the print command from the File menu.
5. IMPORTANT: The "shrink to fit" box (in Acrobat 4, called "Fit to Page") in the Acrobat print dialog window **should not** be checked. Checking it can cause Acrobat-based printing to go extremely slowly.
6. Now you can click on "OK" to print your article.



E-mailing PDF file to Yourself:

1. Click on Download.
2. From the "Item to be Downloaded:" page, scroll down and choose PDF: Economy – Smaller file size with fax quality resolution. This option will download the article in Acrobat PDF format within your browser.
3. NOTE: It may take several minutes for the article to download in Acrobat. Click on the download link only once – multiple clicks will delay the downloading of the article.
4. Once the article has downloaded successfully, go to File.
5. Select "Send," and select "Page by Email."
6. Type in your complete email address.
7. Click on send button.
8. NOTE: To download/print JSTOR articles at home/office, you will need the Adobe Acrobat Reader. All University/College Library computers should have this reader installed. To download a free copy of Adobe Acrobat Reader, go to <http://www.adobe.com/acrobat>
